



Gordon W. Lathrop is a pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and a retired professor of liturgy. In recent years he has taught at the St. Thomas Aquinas University in Rome, the University of Copenhagen in Denmark., and the Virginia Theological Seminary in Alexandria, VA. From 2006-2012 he was Visiting Professor of Liturgical Studies in Yale Divinity School and the Institute of Sacred Music. After teaching at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia from 1984 until 2004, he was named Professor of Liturgy Emeritus there. He is the author of several books, including *Holy Things: A Liturgical Theology* (Fortress 1993), *Holy People: A Liturgical Ecclesiology* (Fortress 1999), *Holy Ground: A*

*Liturgical Cosmology* (Fortress 2003), *The Pastor: A Spirituality* (Fortress 2006), and *The Four Gospels on Sunday: The New Testament and the Reform of Christian Worship* (Fortress 2012). He was a participant in the preparation of *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* (2006), the current Lutheran service book and hymnal. In 1985 he was the President of the North American Academy of Liturgy. In 2006 he received that Academy's Berakah Award. From August 2011 until August 2013 he was President of Societas Liturgica, the international society of scholars in liturgy. In 2011 he received an honorary doctorate in theology from the University of Helsinki, Finland. He lives now in Arlington, Virginia, in the greater Washington DC area, and is on the clergy roster of the Metropolitan DC Synod of the ELCA and a member of Resurrection Lutheran Church in Arlington.
